#### RECENT PoWG ACTIVITIES

## September 2009 Water Security Workshop

Our four-year (2008-2012) project on water security, funded by the Canadian Water Network, is now in its second year. The goal of this project is to create a Water Security Framework (WSF) with the objective of improving water security in Canada, specifically through improving governance for source protection and land use.

During the first year of this project we sought end-users' views on water security in Canada through a web-based survey and follow-up interviews. We also compiled an inventory of all freshwater related indicators in Canada which will be posted on our website <a href="https://www.watergovernance.ca">www.watergovernance.ca</a> soon.

In September 2009, the Program on Water Governance held its first water security workshop at the Liu Institute at UBC. This two-day workshop brought together 60 water practitioners including project partners (including Health Canada, Environment Canada and NRCan), water professionals, policy makers and end users from across Canada. During the workshop, participants debated key issues relating to water security in Canada, facilitated by documents authored by the project team: the *Canadian Water Security Primer* and *Canadian Approaches to Assessing Water Security: An Inventory of Indicators*. Over the past two decades, he had written about energy, economics and the West for a variety of Canadian publications including Maclean's, Canadian Business, the Globe and Mail, and Reader's Digest. He has won seven National Magazine Awards since 1989 and top honours for investigative writing from the Association of Canadian Journalists. He won the Governor-General's award for this 2002 non-fiction book, Saboteurs. In 2006, his book Pandemonium examined the impact of global trade on disease exchanges and received widespread national acclaim. His latest book, the Tar Sands: Dirty Oil and the Future of a Continent, examines the continental impact of the world's largest energy project and is already a national bestseller.
